#### Honoring Our Diversity

After many years in the Presbyterian Church it is clear to me that diversity is a given; when two or more gather there is always rich variety. Do we try to hide our diversity for fear that our differences will divide us, or do we honor and learn from it? The overwhelming majority of churches, in my view, feel a need to hide their diversity. In public gatherings they display a *groupthink* where there is little disagreement on issues that are difficult, sharing the most difficult issues only within a circle of like-minded people.

Covenant has sought to be a church that wishes to honor and learn from our diversity, believing that genuine disagreement on very important subjects is natural and healthy. However, it is one thing to *talk* about honoring our diversity and quite another to *act* on this value.

At Covenant we are fortunate to hold certain values in common. As a progressively-minded people we affirm the compassion necessary to bring about genuine equality for all people, as well as a new relationship with our planet that will protect its future sustainability. In addition, we believe in an inclusive spirit that welcomes all people into our fellowship, as well as authentic regard for the many spiritual paths that have been shaped by humanity. Finally, we affirm a pilgrim mindset that values the asking of questions instead of assuming doctrinal certainty. These are powerful values over which there is strong consensus.

On the other hand, there are real differences that mark us as a people of faith. The most significant is that we are a Presbyterian Church, for which we make no apology. However, it is also true that we have happily welcomed some members who find themselves challenged by some ideas that have been very important to Presbyterians. One key idea might be stated this way, *"We have found a path to God in the life and teachings of Jesus."* In saying this through the ages, Presbyterians join with other Christians in affirming our search for the spirit of God and by giving unique honor to the person of Jesus. Again, we have gladly welcomed members who are not sure how to think about God, but this does not diminish in any way our quest for the Spirit of God.

Such diverse convictions are common in today's church. What is different at Covenant is that we have made an effort to affirm this natural diversity and to honor it by genuinely embracing one another in the conviction that each person has something to teach us. It is not a threat to our existence that some people are less clear about some values which are cherished by the whole. We have no interest in working to get everyone thinking the same way.


It would be a gross understatement to say that this diversity is easy going. Our leadership (the Session) stands with the **whole church** saying that we are not conflicted about the presence of God, and in looking uniquely to the life and teachings of Jesus in this spiritual journey. We are not conflicted about being Christian – though our definition of being a follower of Jesus is quite different from many traditional definitions. Our leaders pledge to weave this search for God into the total mission of Covenant. Still, we neither expect nor need conformity within our congregation.

The ongoing challenge before us is to learn how to both embrace this core value of learning from the person of Jesus as we all journey unto the Spirit of God, and to welcome those others in our midst who wish to be a part of the Presbyterian Church even though they are uncertain about some of this "faith stuff". The challenge requires mutual respect from all of us; there is nothing that needs to be "fixed". This is who we are. Now can we honor and learn from each other?





**February Sermon Series, Worship Service:** Those who have recited the Lord's Prayer on numerous occasions may think of this prayer as relatively 'plain' or simple. It is anything but this. Dominic Crossan says, "What if the Lord's Prayer is neither a Jewish prayer for Jews nor yet a Christian prayer for Christians? What if it is a prayer from the heart of Judaism on the lips of Christianity for the conscience of the world? What if it is a radical manifesto and a hymn of hope for all humanity in language addressed to all the earth?" Beginning on Sunday, February 1<sup>st</sup>, Chris and Lou will begin an 8 part sermon series on the Lord's Prayer. Their reflections will lean significantly on Crossan's recent book entitled, "*The Greatest Prayer: Rediscovering the Revolutionary Message of the Lord's Prayer"*. There will be a special effort to connect this powerful prayer with the most pressing social issues of our day.
