A Message From Rev. Mark Sandlin

Life is comprised of a series of transformations – one upon another, upon another, upon another. Without them, we stagnate. Without them, we get stuck where we are in life, and life grows dull and strangely thin. Yet, we tend to avoid transformation; we resist change. Or, if we do take on change, we stop at the first bump in the road or at the first sign of “failure.”

As spiritual people who find some of our roots in progressive Christian theology, we should be reminded that God seems to have always been about to do “a new thing.” And that Jesus seemed to constantly be saying, “you have heard it said, but I say...”.

We are to be a people who embrace life, love, and all the changes that necessarily come along with them.

Which brings us to our new schedule for Sunday mornings. As we begin this new chapter of coming together as a spiritual community, I believe it has never been more important for us to actively embrace the idea of transformation. Indeed, transformation is a core of progressive Christian theology. The idea that through love individuals and communities can positively impact change in the world around us is central to our understanding of who we are supposed to be. I'm excited for this community and our opportunity on Sunday mornings to experience in a fresh way the spiritual growth that comes with transformation.

For folks who need a little less packaging in their intentional spiritual time, our 9:15 Gathering should feel like home for your soul. With local musicians performing, time for meditation, the intentional use of more inclusive language in the Reflection, and a time for the whole community to respond, it takes our pledge of being inclusive and open-minded very seriously.

At our 11:15 Gathering, the commitment to being inclusive and open-minded is still palpably present, it just comes with a dash of traditional structure and music that might feel a tad bit more familiar – because sometimes home for your soul means having a comfortable pair of slippers around.

There will, of course, be the inevitable bumps in the road. The trick is to trust in each other and the community that surrounds us, to lean on love and let graciousness be our default position, and to see the bumps in the road not as failures but as fresh sources of information. If we can do those things while keeping communication and feedback flowing in kind and nurturing ways, I have the sense that the transformation will create a spiritual community that is not only very needed, but that is unlike any other.

I'm looking forward to journeying with you.

The Session was moderated by Reverend Mark Sandlin, interim pastor. Mark Cable received an excused absence. In addition to the regular members, Barbara North, Fred Wallace, and George Lockhart, newly-elected elders, were also present.

Session actions:

- ◆ Received Emily Seawall into membership after she shared her faith journey and desire to join Church of the Covenant.
- ◆ Approved the recommendation from the Worship Committee to change the Sunday morning schedule to include two gathering times and two fellowship times. The new schedule will begin on March 6th for a six-month trial period.
- ◆ Discussed an ongoing tenant problem and proposed a possible resolution. Session agreed to have a general discussion at the March meeting concerning tenant issues.
- ◆ Received a report from the Clerk of The Session concerning the statistical report. The clerk also recommended the formation of a committee to review the church rolls and resolve membership issues.
